A Message from the Executive Director: Changing the World

Did you know you can change the world? In fact, you are already changing the world just by reading our newsletter! Your willingness to acknowledge a painful reality that happens to far too many people — the reality of childhood sexual abuse — begins the cycle of awareness that changes the world for survivors and eventually for the community.

Curiosity and creativity are replaced with caution and hiding as children come to realize the world is no longer safe. These children stay small and apart from others to hide their pain.

For so many survivors, the need to keep their secret becomes greater than their desire to form connections with others and risk their secret being revealed. Not surprisingly, it often takes survivors a very long time — well into adulthood — to dare to share their pain, to reach out and ask for help.

Asking for help is the first and most courageous step away from the hiding and shame of sexual abuse. And whether the survivor realizes it or not, reaching out for help opens the possibility of their world beginning to change in hopeful and healing ways.

Although every survivor's path is their own unique journey, they have one thing in common. Every survivor's journey to healing begins with connection to another human being. There must be one person who listens, who cares, who understands, and most importantly believes what the survivor, whether a child or adult, is sharing.

It's understandable that in the face of such enormous and complex suffering it may be hard to believe that one person could make a difference — but it does — and your willingness to care and consider the



Your support is a vital part of the healing process for the many people impacted by childhood sexual abuse:

- Last year, RPC provided 1,960 hours of individual therapy (including 400+ hours funded through a sliding-fee-scale and 450+ scholarship hours).
- 1,630 hours of group therapy (couples, partners, male-identified, & female-identified groups).
- Currently, in addition to the many hours of individual therapy provided by our Licensed Mental Health Counselors, RPC has **four active therapy groups**, each with weekly meetings.
- Almost half of RPC's clients are low income individuals on their journey who benefit from the generous support of you, our community of donors.
